## **Minutes – Monday, March 10, 2024 Annual Parish Meeting**

### **1. Apologies (with reasons for absence)**

### **2. Minutes**

The minutes of the meeting held on Monday, March 11, 2024 were approved.

### **3. Opening remarks**

Cllr Martin Stanbury welcomed everybody to the meeting.

### **4. Cornwall Councillor's report – report from Cllr Adam Paynter**

Cllr Paynter talked about plans to refresh the Local Plan. The waste and recycling changes are being rolled out. The 20mph limits are also being rolled out – Boyton will be in the later stage. He said there was quite a lot of resurfacing going on in Cornwall.

Questions to Cllr Paynter:

Cllr Paynter was asked about the possible 40mph speed limit at Langdon Cross. He said a consultation has taken place and it is hoped a reduced speed limit will be put into place. There have been several nasty accidents close to the junction. He said 60mph was quite fast to be travelling going over the brow of the hill.

He was also asked about the Launceston Library plans. The library will now not be moving to Exeter Street, but instead Launceston Town Council has purchased the former Barclays building to put the library in there. The town council is keen to keep the library in the town. This also frees up the existing library site, which is owned by Cornwall Council.

## **5. Parish council report – Martin Stanbury, parish council chairman**

Cllr Stanbury gave his report and explained that it had been resolved to purchase another speed monitoring device to help tackle the problem of speeding in the parish. He said the money boxes, that were presented to children, to mark the King's Coronation, were greatly appreciated. He thanked the clerk and his fellow councillors for their work throughout the year.

## **6. Presentation of Parish Cup**

The Parish Cup has been awarded to Gilbert Heal. Gilbert has lived in Boyton all his life. He has taken great pride in the appearance of his property and the village, and is very supportive of village events. Cllr Stanbury said that Gilbert spends a lot of time quietly doing things around the village, all of which are greatly appreciated by the parishioners.
